How will my group benefit from the Tire Round-Up?

In addition to a cleaner and safer place to live, Tire Round-Up projects promote neighborhood clean-ups and beautification efforts that stimulate civic pride.

Registered participants will be reimbursed 50 cents for each illegally discarded tire brought to the drop-off site. The tire drop-off limit will be 1,000 tires per group.

Proceeds from the Tire Round-Up Program are to be used for worthwhile community projects.

Tire Round-up Program

Help the City collect illegally discarded tires from your neighborhood and earn 50 cents per tire collected.

What is the Tire Round-Up Program?

In 1995, the Streets Department developed the Tire Round-Up Program to address the problem of illegally discarded tires in the City of Philadelphia. The program removes illegally discarded tires from the city streets, sidewalks, parks, alleys, and riverbanks. Registered community groups participate in the program and receive 50 cents for each tire they collect and bring to designated drop-off sites.

By collecting illegally discarded tires and properly disposing of them, community groups reduce the amount of materials that enter the waste stream. This effort also removes an unsightly and potentially hazardous material that contribute to the deteriorating conditions of our city.

Through this program, community groups raise funds and participate in neighborhood beautification efforts that promote civic pride and neighborhood empowerment!

What Tires can be Collected During the Tire Round-up?



- Only illegally discarded tires may be taken to any one of the designated locations on the specified dates.
- Tires donated from locations required to pay a fee for private disposal are not eligible for the drop-off program. Examples of these locations are auto repair shops, car dealers, mechanic shops, and private storage lots.
- Groups that drop off ineligible tires will not be paid and will be disqualified from further participation in the program.
- Participating groups must have a registered ID number to drop off tires. The City will not assume responsibility for tires dropped off under an incorrect ID number.

How will the City reimburse groups for tires collected?



- A check will be issued to each organization based on the number of eligible tires that were dropped off under the group's identification number.
- For the length of the program, total reimbursement for any one group will be limited to not more than \$500.00, or 1,000 tires total.

Registration and Participation Checklist

1

Appoint a Round-Up Coordinator: Block Captains can be coordinators for their blocks. Community organizations and partnership groups should appoint a coordinator.

2

Register for the Tire Round-Up Program with the Philadelphia More Beautiful Committee (PMBC) by calling (215) 685-3981.

3

Following verification of your eligibility, your group will be notified by mail of your identification number together with an agreement form, list of drop-off locations and hours of operation.

4

Return your group's signed agreement form to be eligible for drop-off and reimbursement.

5

Start planning for your clean-up by setting a date and finding the closest tire drop off site for your group, a list of sites will be included in your eligibility confirmation that comes by mail.

6

Temporary drop off sites are open from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. on designated Saturdays and are strategically located throughout the City of Philadelphia.
