Streets Department Announces Street Improvement in the Northwest

Temporary, Full Street Closures and Parking Restrictions Expected

PHILADELPHIA – Streets Commissioner Carlton Williams announced today that street improvement work will occur in the Germantown area of the city beginning for the week of April 1st. The work schedule includes temporary, full street closures and parking restrictions. Weather or special events in the area may alter the work schedule. The contractor will perform street improvement operations on the following streets:

- Collom Street, from Wakefield Street to Rufe Street
- E. Ashmead Street, from Wakefield Street to Rubicam Street
- E. Bringhurst Street, from Wakefield Street to Rufe Street
- Magnolia Street, from Armstrong Street to Church Lane
- Magnolia Street, from Church Lane to E. Cheltenham Avenue
- E. Queen Lane, from Magnolia Street to W. Clarkson Avenue
- Potterton Heights, from Magnolia Street to Dead End
- Heiskell Street, from Baynton Street to E. Armat Street
- Heiskell Street, from E. Armat Street to Morton Street
- E. Armat Street, from Baynton Street to Morton Street
- Utah Street, from E. Armat Street to Heiskell Street
- Morton Street, from E. Armat Street to Heiskell Street
- E. Woodlawn Street, from Morton Street to Magnolia Street
- E. Woodlawn Street, from Musgrave Street to Chew Avenue
- Church Lane, from Belfield Avenue to Chew Avenue
- N. Uber Street, from W. 65th Avenue to 67th Avenue
- N. 18th Street, from 66th Avenue to Haines Street
- Temple Road, from E. Upsal Street to E. Phil Ellena Street
- Temple Road, from E. Phil Ellena Street to Vernon Road

Street improvement work is related to the initial phase of the City's street resurfacing program. Work will be completed in separate phases – milling, adjusting of manhole covers, and resetting of utility boxes – which will take place in separate activities over the course of the week. Operations for the milling work will be performed during the day hours, between 7A.M. and 4P.M. Milling of each street segment is expected to last approximately 1-2 days per street. Work for adjusting of manhole covers and resetting of utility boxes will be scheduled during the day, between the hours of 7A.M. and 4P.M., and is expected to last approximately 1-2 days per street. Schedule of operations for the final asphalt resurfacing on these streets will be announced via a separate press release.

To complete the work, residents should expect parking restrictions. Temporary 'No Parking' signs will be posted in advance of each scheduled activity. Residents are urged to move their cars from the work sites when temporary 'No Parking' signs are posted, so that vehicles are not towed. In the event a car is towed, please contact your local Police District to determine its location. Motorists are advised to allow extra time when traveling around the work areas.

The work is being completed by Tony DePaul & Son. The project is being financed with 100% City Capital Budget Funds.

While the Streets Department will make every effort to minimize disruption to traffic, citizens are urged to plan ahead and use alternative routes when traveling in these areas. The Streets Department thanks citizens in advance for their patience and cooperation as we work to improve city streets.
